# Unit 1: Old English Period up to Classics

### **Lesson 1: Beowulf**

### **LEARNING OBJECTIVES**

- Read and appreciate an Old English Literature.
- Identify the distinguishing features of notable Anglo-American lyric poetry, songs, poems, sermons, and allegories.
- Explain the different elements of short stories.
- Share prior knowledge about a topic.

### **DEVELOPMENTAL ACTIVITIES**

### **Preparatory Activities**

### **GENERALIZATION**

- The elements of a short story are characters, setting, plot, theme and point of view.
- Prior knowledge refers to the information that a person already possess before accepting new information.
